


MATSUTAKE, KNIGHTS, CATS, **CHICKEN & WOODWAXES** firm fleshed, some with ring, attached gills, white spores p.234-253



MILKCAPS & BRITTLEGILLS stems break like chalk, no ring, smooth cap, white, cream to yellow spores, Milkcaps oozing milk, p.192-205



MEADOW & HORSE MUSHROOMS & PRINCE, pink (whitish) free gills turning chocolate brown from spores, with ring

> WEBCAPS, SHEATHED RINGED WOODTUFT & others WEBCAP with rusty brown spores, attached gills, with ring or web



FLY AGARIC & AMANITAS smooth cap with wards or patch, widened stem base with cup or rings. free gills, white spores p. 206-224


